2022 Scholarship Fundraising

Again in 2022, an awesome group of donors stepped up and very generously made tax deductible contributions to the Millwood-Waterford Scholarship Fund. Some of the donors have consistently donated over the last several years and others are new donors. Please know that we sincerely appreciate everyone for whatever contribution



you made. Without your donations we would not have the funds to keep the scholarship program going, especially since we have not been able to take any fundraising trips in the past few years due to the continuing health and safety concerns due to the coronavirus and the variants.

Even though mandates were lifted, new variants have caused some people

to be hesitant about gathering in large crowds or on crowed buses. Therefore, your support has made it possible for the MWCA to raise \$4,665.00 in 2022 to continue offering high school graduates in Prince George's County scholarships. If awarded a scholarship their first year of college, they may reapply each year thereafter. If they meet the criteria for continuing education support, they can receive an award for the remaining three years. Therefore, we must ensure that we always have sufficient funds available to support the continuing education program.

Our donors provide an education lifeline to the students in reaching their goals of obtaining higher education at a four year or two year college, or a trade school. We know that a mind is a terrible thing to waste, so by donating to the scholarship fund, you help us to help students obtain their educational dreams.

We are not sure if or when in 2023 we will begin to take scholarship fundraising trips; therefore, we ask that you continue to make tax deductible contributions to the Millwood-Waterford Citizens Association, Inc., designating MWCA Scholarship Fund in the memo line of your check or money order. These funds are used exclusively for the MWCA Scholarship Program.

TRASH

Only 2 items may be placed with your regular trash for pick up on Tuesday. If more than 2 items, they will NOT be picked up.

Do not put at curb until Monday before the Tuesday pickup day.

YARD WASTE

Leaves, grass and branches are waste.



picked up on Monday only.

No plastic bags. Use paper yard bags or a trash can marked yard waste.

Tie branches together.

Do not put at curb until Sunday afternoon/evening.

For large white items and tires call 311 for an appointment.

Do not put at curb until the day before the scheduled pick up date.
