PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR 2019

We, the Millwood-Waterford community, have not only changed the way we age, but also the way we play and give back to the community and County. For this we are thankful!

With the help of our faithful partners; Park and Planning/Recreation, DPIE, District IIII Police-CAC and (COP), DPW&T, and District 6 Councilman we have:

Donated over \$5,000 in student uniforms, student and teacher supplies, lunches, and caps and gowns to graduating students at our three community schools, John E. Bayne Elementary School, Walker Mill Middle School, and Central High School.

Volunteered along with Fairfield Knolls community to trim bushes, pull weeds, mulch trees and plant flowers at John E. Bayne School in May and October in the "Green up-Clean up" county wide program.
