# **President's Report for 2023**

# "KEEPING THE PROMISE"

When I took office many years ago, I made many promises over the years. The progress became challenging. As time passed, we developed more ways to keep the residents informed and engaged in County and community activities. Today, I will say we have stayed informed and remained active.

We continued having virtual meetings through April 2023 due to the "life-changing Covid-19 virus." When the ban was lifted in April 2023, we began to meet physically at the Millwood Center in May and June. There were guest speakers at both virtual and regular meetings.

Speakers in 2023 included: Representatives from Department of Public Works, Jackson Hewitt Tax Services, Head Planner of Walker Mill Regional Park, NUSUN Solar Systems, District 3 and District 8 PGCP Department, Department of Inspection and Enforcement, Health Department, Harmony Memorial Gardens, and Blue Line Corridor. In November, Delegate Nick Charles, a veteran, addressed our veterans.

Our regular bi-annual Community Clean-Ups were suspended, as were some of our community garden and flower contests. Our entertainment and bus trips were also cancelled.

However, in August the community became alive again. With the Covid-19 virus ban lifted, residents began to clean up the flower humps and their own streets. We celebrated "National Night Out" with over 100 guests, county officials, and residents in attendance (see photos page 5).

Special thanks to our Parks and Recreation partners for their assistance and support with our picnic. We celebrated our Community Picnic with over 125 friends and county partners (see photos page 4).

Police, State's Attorney Aisha Braveboy, Councilwoman Wala Blegay, and former County Executive Jack Johnson and his wife Leslie were in attendance. Others were Major Waddy, District 6, COP officers, and Park and Recreation Partners. There were food and other vendors, games, skate mobile, basketball and many other activities.

In October 2023, we awarded four (4) new scholarships and one (1) continuing education scholarship for a total of \$3,800 (see Scholarship Report, page 8).

November brought cooler weather. However, our veterans were honored (see photos on page 5). Our two young volunteers, Sheila Russell and Tawana Wilson, ordered and delivered ten Thanksgiving dinners to our homebound residents. We also gave food bags and turkeys to needy residents.

As we came to the close of 2023, we ended the year with a joyful Christmas Award Night. Many of our community partners and county officials joined us for our Christmas celebration. We enjoyed a delightful rendition of the 12 Days of Christmas, as well as a humorous educational Bible quiz, by Domino Blaske.

Our guest list included Delegate Derick E. Davis, Delegate Nick Charles, Capt. Bryant, District 3 Police, Councilwoman Wala Blegay, Denise Roberts, Belinda Queen (CEO-Coffee Club), Walter and Linda Redman, President of D'arcy Woods Civic Association, and Daisy Maggett, President of Wilburn Civic Association, to name a few.

What a joyful night. Santa Clause handed out gifts to attendees. Everyone enjoyed refreshments and conversation. Thanks to the planning committee.

The community enjoyed the Watkins Park "Festival of Lights" which was outstanding again this year. It was like "Disney World in Prince George's County." (See photos on page 8).

I wish to thank all of the community and our partners for their support. Together we have maintained our community. We will continue to grow and develop new ideas for a more livable community.

# Backyard Gardening by Valeria Wilson

Yes, backyard gardening is easy and therapeutic. It does not take a lot of ground space to enjoy a few vegetables. A small space in the ground or a flower pot or other container, even an old grill, or old wheelbarrow, as examples, can provide just what you need to grow delicious food.

Yes, I grew string beans in an old grill and a flower pot. White potatoes, sweet potatoes, tomatoes, and bell peppers were grown in a flower pot, as well as in a small space in the ground. It is fun to watch green bean seeds come up, develop into plants, then blooms, and finally little green beans that get larger and larger. Finally, it is time to pick them and prepare a meal, no matter how small the amount of produce. Also cucumber, zucchini or other seeds should be planted in the ground because they need space for the vines to spread.

Don't forget to plant some tomatoes, no matter what variety you like. I have reaped the benefit of cherry tomato plants coming up for two years without planting new ones. The seeds drop and they come back the next year. I took some of the plants from the ground and put them in a flower pot and they produced in the flower pot as well. So get your flower pot or other container ready, the soil of your choice, your seeds or plants, and get ready to grow what you like.
